



ABBREVIATIONS USED IN CORRECTION

WO	word order is not correct
G	grammar mistake
coll	colloquialism (no don'ts in a scholarly paper, no colloquial expressions)
T	tense
comma splice	<u>two main clauses</u> cannot be separated by a comma only; they have to be linked (the other option is that you write two individual sentences)
ref	reference (problem when you write "it" and it is not clear to what "it" refers; or "they" and it is not clear who they are)
sent constr.	faulty sentence construction
par.	faulty parallel construction (e.g. Jean is an artist, spends some time at athletics, and likes planes. Correct: Jean is an artist, an athlete, and a pilot.)
WC	wrong word or wrong vocabulary
cong	congruence (e.g. "Paul go to school" or "their life")
run-on	sentences are too long and should be cut up and better structured
sp	spelling mistake
prep	wrong preposition
exp	wrong expression
id	not idiomatic
Ger	sounds German
rep	repetition
punct	punctuation
frag	sentence fragment (the sentence is not complete)
DM	dangling modifier
st	style
